FDIC APPOINTS HELGERSON, ROHAN TO TOP POSITIONS IN ATLANTA REGION

The FDIC Board of Directors announced today the appointment of Lyle V. Helgerson as Regional Director and Patrick J. Rohan as Deputy Regional Director of the Division of Supervision (DOS) in Atlanta.

Mr. Helgerson, who has been the Deputy Regional Director in Atlanta since 1988, replaces A. David Meadows, who is returning to the Washington headquarters as deputy to FDIC Vice Chairman Andrew C. (Skip) Hove, Jr. Mr. Rohan, the Assistant Regional Director of the Division of Supervision's office in Chicago since 1986, will assume Mr. Helgerson's former duties in Atlanta. The appointments became effective yesterday.

The Atlanta office is responsible for the supervision of FDIC-insured banks and back-up supervision of FDIC-insured savings and loan associations in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia.

DOS Director Paul Fritts said: "We are pleased to have Lyle Helgerson and Pat Rohan available to fill these important senior positions. Both are quality managers and regulators, and I have a great deal of confidence that they will continue the fine leadership established by Dave Meadows."

Mr. Helgerson was appointed Atlanta's Deputy Regional Director in July 1988 after serving as Assistant Regional Director there since 1982. He was chief review examiner in the Minneapolis Region from 1977 until his transfer to Atlanta in 1982. Mr. Helgerson began his FDIC career as a bank examiner trainee in Minneapolis in 1963. He holds a BA degree in Business Administration from Winona State University, Winona, Minnesota, and is

a graduate of the Graduate School of Banking and the Post Graduate School of Banking at the University of Wisconsin.

Mr. Rohan joined the FDIC in 1970 as a bank examiner trainee in Chicago. He became a commissioned examiner in December 1973 and a review examiner in 1982 before being named Assistant Regional Director in November 1986. He is a graduate of Loyola University of Chicago, the Loyola University School of Law and the Stonier Graduate School of Banking.
