## FDIC OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS IS REORGANIZED

The FDIC's Office of Legislative Affairs has reorganized with the naming of separate Deputy Directors for the FDIC and the Resolution Trust Corporation. Alice C. Goodman has been named Deputy Director and Loren T. Hooper has been designated Deputy Director-RTC within the Office of Legislative Affairs.

Beth L. Climo, Director of the Office of Legislative Affairs, said:
"The reorganization of the Legislative Affairs Office is necessary to handle the new challenges arising from the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 — both with respect to our traditional FDIC role and our new responsibilities operating the Resolution Trust Corporation. We are fortunate to have Ms. Goodman and Mr. Hooper to take on these assignments."

Ms. Goodman joined the FDIC in 1988 as Legislative Advisor after ten years with the House Banking Committee. A native of Virginia, Ms. Goodman holds a B.S. degree from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and a Masters in Public Administration from the George Washington University.

Mr. Hooper joined the FDIC in 1984 as Legislative Attorney and Advisor. He previously served as General Counsel to Senator Bob Kasten (R.-Wis.), and prior to that was with the Internal Revenue Service in Washington, D.C. Mr. Hooper holds a B.A. from Indiana University, a Masters in Psychology from Wichita State University, a J.D. from the University of San Diego Law School and an L.L.M. in tax law from Georgetown University. He is a native of Indiana.
