FDIC NAMES MARK ROSEN
DEPUTY GENERAL COUNSEL

The Board of Directors of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation has approved the appointment of Mark I. Rosen as Deputy General Counsel. He will head the Closed Bank Investigation & Litigation Branch of the Legal Division.

John L. Douglas, FDIC General Counsel, said: "Mark brings an extensive background in all areas of FDIC legal work which, together with his sound judgment, makes him an invaluable asset to us."

Mr. Rosen, 36, a native of Plainview, New York, has spent his entire legal career with the FDIC. He joined the FDIC Honors Program for Attorneys in 1976 and subsequently held senior attorney and counsel positions.

From 1984 until his current appointment he was Assistant General Counsel in charge of the FDIC's claims against directors and officers of failed banks.

Mr. Rosen graduated from Cornell University in 1973 where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He graduated cum laude from the Cornell Law School in 1976. Mr. Rosen is a member of the New York Bar and The New York County Bar Association. He and his wife, Lynn, have two children, John and Michael.
