FDIC NAMES ASSISTANT REGIONAL DIRECTORS FOR CHICAGO AND KANSAS CITY DBS REGIONS

The Board of Directors of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation today announced the appointment of assistant regional directors for the Chicago and Kansas City Regions of the Division of Bank Supervision (DBS). Patrick J. Rohan will be the new ARD in Chicago and Raymond K. Pritchett will serve in Kansas City. Each has been serving as a review examiner in his respective region. The appointments are effective November 23, 1986.

DBS Director Paul G. Fritts said: "Both Pat and Ray are well qualified for their new positions and the Division is pleased that their considerable skills are available to assist in the management of these sizeable regions."

Mr. Rohan, 38, joined the FDIC in 1970 as a bank examiner trainee in Chicago. He became a commissioned examiner in December 1973 and a review examiner in September 1982, serving all his FDIC assignments in the Chicago Region.

Mr. Rohan, a native of Chicago, is a graduate of Loyola University of Chicago and of The Stonier Graduate School of Banking. He currently is attending Loyola University School of Law and expects to receive his degree in January. He and his wife, Jacqueline, have three children.

Mr. Pritchett, 38, came to the FDIC as a bank examiner trainee in Grand Island, Nebraska, in June 1970. He became a commissioned examiner in August 1974 in Grand Island. He served as a field office supervisor in Lincoln, Nebraska, before becoming a review examiner in the Omaha Region in November 1983. He was reassigned to the Kansas City Region as a review examiner in June 1985.
