WALKER NAMED REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR DIVISION OF BANK SUPERVISION IN DALLAS

The Board of Directors of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation today announced the appointment of Kenneth L. Walker as Director of the Dallas Region of the Division of Bank Supervision (DBS) effective March 30, 1986. He succeeds Roy Jackson who is retiring after 30 years of FDIC service.

Mr. Walker has been Assistant DBS Director for Supervision and Enforcement Activities since April 1985. He was Regional Director in Philadelphia from June 1984 through March 1985.

DBS Director Robert V. Shumway said: "Mr. Jackson has had a long and distinguished career as one of our most knowledgeable and experienced regional directors. He will be missed. We are fortunate to have an able successor in Mr. Walker who has broad experience in bank supervision at both the Washington and field office level."

Mr. Jackson has been Regional Director in Dallas since March of 1980. He came to Dallas after serving as Regional Director in Memphis since 1973. He first joined the Corporation in 1956 and became Assistant Supervising Examiner in the Dallas office in 1967. In 1969 he was appointed Assistant Regional Director in Memphis, becoming Regional Director in 1973.

A native of Klondike, Texas, Mr. Jackson holds a BS from East Texas State University in Commerce, Texas, and is a graduate of The Graduate School of Banking of the South at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge.

Mr. Walker came to the FDIC as an examiner trainee in Lincoln, Nebraska, in 1968 and later worked in field offices in Nebraska and Iowa as an examiner. He was named Field Office Supervisor in the Lincoln, Nebraska,

Field Office in 1975, and in the Omaha, Nebraska, Field Office in 1979. He became Chief Review Examiner in the Omaha Region in 1981 and Assistant Regional Director in Philadelphia in April 1983.

Mr. Walker, 45, a native of Lincoln, Nebraska, is a graduate of the University of Nebraska with a BS in business and economics, and of the graduate and post-graduate School of Banking at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. He and his wife, Nancy, have two children.
