FDIC NAMES MAE CULP DIRECTOR OF OFFICE OF EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation today announced the selection of Mrs. Mae Culp as Director of the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity for the FDIC, effective November 18, 1984. Mrs. Culp has been Acting Deputy Director of the Office of Equal Employment and Civil Rights for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) since February 1980. She also was manager of the Federal Women's Program at the FDA during that period.

At the FDIC she will be responsible for all equal employment opportunity activities, including the Federal Women's Program, the Hispanic Employment Program, the Selective Placement Program for the Handicapped, the Veterans Federal Employment Program, and other special employment emphasis programs.

Margaret L. Egginton, Deputy to the FDIC Chairman, to whom Mrs. Culp will report, said: "Mrs. Culp has an outstanding record as a leader in the Federal Women's Program and in programs dealing with minority employment, employee health problems and similar concerns. She will provide sensitive, effective management of the equal employment opportunity programs at the FDIC."

From June 1975 to February 1980 Mrs. Culp was Deputy EEO Officer for the National Institute on Alcoholism and Alcohol Abuse. Prior to that she was a personnel management specialist for the Public Health Service and also had 15 years experience in the personnel field working for the U.S. Navy.

In 1984 she received the Outstanding Achievement Award from Federally Employed Women (FEW), and the Commissioner's Special Achievement Award from the Food and Drug Administration. She also received a certificate of appreciation from Montgomery County, Maryland, for her two and one-half years service on the County Commission for Women.

Mrs. Culp, 49, is a native of Oakland, California. She and her husband, Joseph, have two children.
