SANDRA A. WALDROP NAMED REGIONAL DIRECTOR  
OF FDIC MEMPHIS REGION

FDIC Chairman William M. Isaac today announced the appointment of Sandra A. Waldrop as Regional Director for the Memphis, Tennessee, Region effective November 7, 1983. Ms. Waldrop has been Regional Director in the Columbus, Ohio, Region since August 1982.

Robert V. Shumway, Director of the Division of Bank Supervision, said: "Ms. Waldrop's performance in the Columbus Region has earned her the respect and admiration of her colleagues both in the FDIC and in the banking community. She is well qualified to take on the challenges she will face in her new assignment."

Ms. Waldrop, 40, joined the FDIC as a bank examiner (trainee) in the Tampa, Florida, Field Office in 1966. She became a commissioned examiner in 1970. Ms. Waldrop served periodically as an instructor for the Corporation's Junior School and the Basic Trust School at the FDIC Training Center in Rosslyn, Virginia, over a two-year period beginning in 1970.

She served as a review examiner with varied responsibilities in the Atlanta Regional Office from 1972 until being named Assistant Regional Director in Atlanta in 1980.
