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DIC Makes Public November Enforcement Actions; One Administrative Hearing Scheduled for January 2014

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) today released a list of orders of administrative enforcement actions taken against banks and individuals in November. One administrative hearing is scheduled for January 2014.

The FDIC issued a total of 37 orders and one notice. The orders included: three consent orders; one prompt corrective action; six removal and prohibition orders; two cross guarantee liabilities; two voluntary termination of insurance orders; five civil money penalties; five section 19 orders; 13 terminations of consent orders and cease and desist orders; and one notice.
