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FDIC Makes Public December Enforcement Actions; No Administrative Hearings Scheduled for February 2013

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) today released a list of orders of administrative enforcement actions taken against banks and individuals in December. No administrative hearings are scheduled for February 2013.

The FDIC issued a total of 71 orders and one notice of charges in December. The orders included: eleven consent orders; 17 removal and prohibition orders; 13 civil money penalties; one supervisory prompt corrective action; one voluntary termination of insurance; 12 section 19 orders; one modification order; 14 orders terminating consent orders and cease and desist orders; one order terminating supervisory prompt corrective action directive; and one notice.
