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FDIC Makes Public May Enforcement Actions; No Administrative Hearings Scheduled for July 2014

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) today released a list of orders of administrative enforcement actions taken against banks and individuals in May. No administrative hearings are scheduled for July 2014.

The FDIC issued a total of 39 orders. The orders included: two consent orders; one prompt corrective action directive; seven removal and prohibition orders; seven section 19 orders; three civil money penalties; 16 orders terminating consent orders and cease and desist orders; one order dismissing notice of assessment of civil money penalties and order to pay; one order terminating supervisory prompt corrective action directive; and one final order of dismissal.
