## TO:CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERSUBJECT:Fraudulent Instruments

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) has received information that "warrants" have been issued by the Republic of Texas/The Republic of Texas Trust. The instruments have appeared in various places in the United States, particularly in the state of Texas, and one has appeared in Puerto Rico. Such instruments are deemed to have no financial value. A copy of one such instrument is attached.

The instruments contain the heading "Republic of Texas," include a seal and a Warrant Number, and state they are issued to The Republic of Texas Trust, c/o HCR-74 Box 101A, Fort Davis, TPZ 79734, The Republic of Texas. The instruments appear to be originated by Richard Lance McClaren, "Chief Ambassador and Consul General" of the so-called Republic of Texas. The Republic of Texas is not a recognized sovereign entity within the state of Texas.
