

## FOREIGN ASSETS CONTROL ACT

TO: CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

SUBJECT: Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons

On November 7, 2001, the Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) amended its listing of specially designated nationals and blocked persons by adding a significant number of terrorist organizations and individuals, including certain money transmitters and others in the United States. Their assets must be blocked immediately.

Attached is information from OFAC containing the additions. Also attached is information from OFAC containing all changes to the list of Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons since January 1, 2001. OFAC has asked that we distribute the information to all FDIC-supervised institutions so records can be checked for accounts that are required to be blocked.
