 Steps to Help Rebuild Areas Affected by Recent Tornadoes

 Summary:
 The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) has announced a series of steps intended to facilitate the process of rebuilding in areas damaged by recent tornadoes.

Recent tornadoes from the Gulf of Mexico to the Great Lakes have resulted in deaths, injuries and property damage. States affected include Alabama, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, and West Virginia. The FDIC is encouraging banks to work constructively with borrowers affected by the tornadoes who are experiencing difficulties beyond their control. The FDIC has prepared the attached guidelines stating that extending repayment terms, restructuring existing loans or easing terms for new loans, if done in a manner consistent with sound banking practices, can both contribute to the health of the community and serve the long-term interests of the lending institution. The guidelines also address other types of regulatory relief.
